## The National Police Memorial

The National Police Memorial was completed and dedicated on 29 September 2006 and was created to pay tribute to Australian police officers who have been killed on duty or have died as a result of their duties since the advent of policing in Australia. The Memorial recognises the unique nature of police service and the dangers that police face in their daily pursuits.

## National Police Remembrance Day

In April 1989, the Conference of Commissioners of Police of Australasia and the South West Pacific Region, provided support for a national remembrance day for police officers killed on duty.

The associated memorial service in the ACT is held annually on the nearest working day to 29 September 2009, the feast day of Saint Michael (the Archangel) Patron Saint of Police. This service is now an important event on the policing calendar. It provides an opportunity to honour the memory of those police men and women who have given their lives in the service of the community.

Prior to the service the Remembrance Parade marches from Rond Terraces, the axis of the Parliamentary Triangle and location of the Emergency Services Memorial, to the NPM site. This march is a public display by current and former members of their support for lost colleagues.

## Location

The National Police Memorial is located in Kings Park on the northern shore of Lake Burley Griffin adjacent to Aspen Island and the National Carillon.
